- Last Day to Register to Vote Oct. 5
- Early Voting Oct. 13 Oct. 30
- Last Day to Apply for Ballot by Mail (Received, not Postmarked) Oct. 23

My Personal Tips to Make Your Plan

Legal Election Dates	Voting/Elections Issue Chair Notes
Last Day to Register to Vote Monday, October 5, 2020	Go to Register2Vote.org to confirm current registration and/or to register. Best to do before September 18. With no TX online registration, you receive a form to sign and mail back (postage paid).
First Day of Early Voting Tuesday, October 13, 2020	Early Voting was extended by the Governor. Early Voting in person is open to anyone. Choose a convenient time to avoid lines. The earlier, the better!
Last Day of Early Voting Friday, October 30, 2020	You can vote this day, but often the last Early Voting day is as busy as Election Day.
Last Day to Apply for Ballot by Mail (Received, not Postmarked) Friday, October 23, 2020	DO NOT WAIT! The Oct. 23rd legal deadline has for years offered the false promise of getting a request for ballot delivered, receiving a ballot in return, and mailing back the completed ballot. Best to get the application in the mail by Oct. 9th.



My Personal Tips to Make Your Plan

Legal Election Dates	Voting/Elections Issue Chair Notes
Last day to Receive Ballot by Mail Tuesday, November 3, 2020 (Election Day) at 7:00 p.m. if the envelope is not postmarked, or Wednesday, November 4, 2020 (next business day after Election Day) at 5:00 p.m. if carrier envelope is postmarked by 7:00 pm	Mail ballots returned early are normally counted without issues, as shown in July 14 election. A new additional process is offered just for this election because of COVID-19 and it being a Presidential election. The Gov. decreed you may return a voted mail ballot anytime after receiving it to the Early Voting Clerk's Office (with a voter ID). Must be turned in by Election Day. Check your
Election Day November 3, 2020	County Election website for more details. Many voters love Election Day voting excitement. Safe fun this year is voting by mail if you are eligible, using the nearly 3-week early voting period with short or no lines, and avoiding long lines on Nov. 3rd.
